- Still looking for alternates for meetings
- Auburn and Atkinson need members

#### **Updates:**

- Auburn Improvement Project:
  - o No one from Auburn is at the meeting
  - o Maybe another site walk like the one done a year ago
  - o Talk with contractor to see if they could beautify the area through their own volunteer time (they can leave their business sign up after) after the project gets finished
  - o The state of NH is doing this project and money is getting tighter
  - o A potential for a Phase 2: military monument across from town hall to provide a clearing for the brook
    - Maybe waterworks again?
    - Waterworks will be needed to maintain these projects
  - o Need an Auburn representative to facilitate this project
- Signage:
  - o North to Salem Rd and a sign coming from Robert Frost has not yet been put out...  
Tina will follow up

#### **Trolley Tour Details:**

- Biggest issue: tour route determination
  - o Jean and Rob will drive the byway on July 17 in the afternoon
- Start and end at Pinkerton Academy:

- Designated parking – a resource officer will coordinate
- Culinary students will make lunch at a free to minimal cost rate
- It might be beneficial to still reach out to local restaurants for 10% off with a trolley card for that day or maybe valid for a week
  - Maybe Auburn HOP
  - Maybe a Robert Frost Museum deal depending on if it's still open
- Trolley cost:
  - If the estimated cost is around \$500, then it would be \$25 minimum per person in case enough tickets are not bought
  - Possibility of creating a waiting list and calling people day of if there is space
- Advertising/marketing:
  - A byway passport marking places to visit and maybe restaurants
  - Active marketing: set ups on Derry Rail Trail, at car shows, at Pinkerton Pizza Festival
  - Huge banners hanging off front of tables were a popular idea and Bobby has a table display set up for use
  - Bikers come through Chester for scarecrows and Jean is seeing if they would possibly schedule a ride through on the same day so people can see and/or potential for pictures
- If success maybe a spring trolley ride as well
- Itinerary details:
  - More to come once the route is driven
  - Deciding if there is enough time to make it to Atkinson in a timely manner
    - Leaving scenic byway to go to 111 and get some of Atkinson and all of Hampstead is a possibility
    - Also talk about using Island Pond Rd
  - Chester Center, Robert Frost Museum possible 15–20-minute restroom stops
    - George is reaching out to see if RF Museum will be open
  - Jean has a PA system for speakers on the trolley to use
  - Determining if there needs to be a speaker for every town?
    - Right now, I believe Hampstead, Chester, Derry and Auburn have potential speakers
  - Vehicle to follow trolley to switch out speakers to allow more room
